Craigslist is notorious for stopping mashups of its site. It's allowed some, but there are plenty of examples of it sending scary cease and desist letters to hobbyists and teenagers who've devised clever re-uses of craigslist postings. The inconsistency and ham-fisted legal attacks have created a chilling effect, stifling the growth of what should be a much more robust CL developer scene. The site has no API and seemingly no interest in building one, so anyone who builds something on top of craigslist data is taking his chances.

Is measuring bandwidth consumed by API calls that hard? CL can just stipulate throttle on API calls (just like almost any other web service does). When the calls/bandwidth volume goes above threshold you ask the caller to pay for bandwidth and extra resources. If you don't have those extra resources at the moment then you ask caller to prepay and get on waitlist.

Alternatively, you can easily allow few official "providers" that replicates your data and provide APIs. These providers can be forprofit or non-profit and would take the risk of providing bandwidth, support etc.

Here the key is the willingness to liberate the data and to support external innovations. The CL clearly doesn't have resources and imagination of 1000s of developers out there and to make advances in this space it needs to enable external developers instead of squashing them with top tier lawyers.
